# BREAKTHROUGHS: You Help Fuel Research and Advance Care

### Here are some of the latest programs and studies you're a part of:



A research project resulted in new protocols that change the way young patients are cared for after an uncomplicated congenital heart surgery. The new protocol reduces the total duration of medications, which decreases potential side effects.



Another study examined young patients diagnosed with Kawasaki disease, an inflammatory disease that sometimes affects a child's heart. Researchers analyzed the impact of sedating a patient during an echocardiogram as a way to improve the standard of care.



A new program focuses on helping parents who have a child born with congenital heart disease. Families who participated in the pilot project received helpful resources and connected with mentor families.
